Thousands Homeless Dhaka,
Bangladesh — A devastating fire tore
through the Korail slum, one of the
largest informal settlements in the
Bangladeshi capital, on the evening of
Tuesday, November 25, 2025,
destroying hundreds of homes and
displacing thousands of families. The
blaze broke out around 17:00 local
time at the densely populated
settlement near the Mohakhali—
Gulshan area. Fanned by highly
flammable materials used in the
construction of makeshift homes, the
fire rapidly spread across vast



sections of the slum, sending residents fleeing into nearby streets, open fields, and roadside areas with limited time to salvage their belongings. Dhaka Fire Service officials

that the fire was brought under control gruelling five-hour operation that late into the night. A total of 17 units battled the flames from both the and Banani sides, eventually

coordinated with fire service units to create strategic containment



lines. Despite widespread destruction, authorities have so far reported no confirmed casualties. However, concerns remain over missing persons. Local residents initially reported that two young children went briefly missing during the chaos of evacuation. Their current status remains unclear as verification efforts continue. Korail slum — widely known locally as Mohakhali Bosti — is estimated to be home to more than 50,000 people, many of whom migrated from rural Bangladesh in search of work. The settlement's dense layout, lack of fire safety measures, illegal electricity connections, and tin-roofed shanties have contributed to repeated fire incidents over the years.
